In the first chapter, "A Scandal in Bohemia," he uses a clever method to obtain a hidden photo of American opera singer Irene Adler and the King. Holmes fakes a fire within Irene Adler's home, leading her to reveal where the photo was hidden. (Holmes watches where Adler goes to protect an important belonging.) The story creates high-stakes moments that bring excitement and send chills down my spine.
