




Dawn Zeng Xinyi (S.2)

When the Japanese company created Hello Kitty and then products like the Hello Kitty luggage, they would not have known the impact their creation would have on the world and millions of people as the cartoon character **swept the world off its feet** (使全世界為之傾倒). Not only children have **fallen under her spell** (對她著迷), but the cute cat figure even has adults who are **fanatical** (癡迷) over her every move. 
Kobe Bryant

Editor's Note: NBA star Kobe Bryant and his daughter along with seven other occupants tragically died in a helicopter crash on January 26th, 2020 in Calabasas, California. Many students at CCPASS admired Kobe Bryant's hard work, will and determination on and off the basketball court.

My hero is Kobe Bryant, a retired ex NBA basketball player. Bryant was a phenomenon in high school leading his team to the Pennsylvania state championship. Bryant was so good that he also won the Naismith High School Player of the Year Award as the best Secondary School player in the United States. Kobe Bryant had his pick to play at any of the best basketball universities in the USA like Duke and North Carolina but he chose to go professional right out of high school.

It was very rare for a secondary school player to go directly into the NBA. But immediately he became the big boss of the Los Angeles Lakers. He has accomplished so much in his 20-year career winning 5 NBA championships, 2 NBA Finals MVP trophies and 1 regular season MVP in 2008. But that's not all. He was also an NBA All Star 18 times and won 2 Olympic Gold Medals in 2008 and 2012. I admire Kobe Bryant for all his accomplishments.



I also admire Kobe Bryant because he had the ability to defy defeat. He always found a way to win no matter the situation. Every time the Lakers were on the verge of losing, Bryant always used his jump shot to bring victory for the Lakers. 

Dear Editor,

I am writing to express my concerns about the current phenomenon of over-protection of the current young generation. That, parents being overly protective of their offspring is a concern for the majority in Hong Kong. Today's youth lack the skills to cope with problems they encounter in their everyday lives which is a potential detriment. Their ability to be self-reliant suffers by being overly protected. As a loyal citizen, who is willing to devote myself to the development of my motherland, I have the solemn obligation to fix this stubborn difficulty by proposing three suggestions.

By analyzing the burgeoning numbers of foreign nannies, there is, clearly, a transparent trend of Hong Kong people relying more and more excessively, on help from others. Sometimes, the love of relaxation and comfort is the sole rationale for hiring a nanny. The nanny will take care of all the housework, including laundry, cooking, or housekeeping. But it enables the younger generation to sit back, relax, and focus on what they are responsible for, schoolwork, games and sleep. Ironically, employers of the nannies really think this would help the development of their children because as pupils they are given spare time to explore the world. However, that is not true. There is an old saying in Chinese, 'you have to take good care of your room before you can take good care of the country'. Doing those trifle things, in contrast with the short-sighted perspectives of those overprotective parents which I disagree with, complement children's lives which teach them to be patient with messy situations, to be problem-solving when presented with difficult tasks and to cultivate creativity.

First to cease this urgent problem, we have to start on the re-education of parents to extinguish the idea of being over-protective as desirable. In my perspective, if parents are given talks based on massive data and conclusive evidence, they will be essentially persuaded to give their beloved kids sensible tasks.

In addition, parents must train those polluted kids to learn respect and mental & physical toughness. That is the solution. Being didactic is not cruel. Children need to be taught and learn how to act morally. Growing students need to be given the moral standard of being responsible and having empathy with other people.

Lastly, on top of what is mentioned above, schools have an obligation to nurture a healthy growing environment by cooperating with parents. School is important for the moral education of children. Students should be consulted and educated by both their school and their family.

To conclude, quoting Michael Jordan, "if nobody will help you, do it alone". The most prestigious celebrities are mostly shaped and emboldened by overcoming mountains and seas of difficulties. People need to be polished to be shiny. I hope generations of Hong Kongers can be as bright as the Sun. I hope they can go out of their comfort zones and encounter problems. I hope they can stop being overprotected. I believe my recommendations would help.


What one other demand could the government concede to, to quell the protests?
